

Twenty-Eight Ways to be a Welcoming Parish!


This Advent, as we are awaiting our Savior, let us be intentional about welcoming Jesus in each other! We will be providing 28 suggestions (one for every day of Advent) on how to be a welcoming parish! Do you have any ideas of your own? Submit them to SrEmilyVincent@StJamesSav.com!

- 8. Stay and chat with others after Mass. This is a great time to catch up with others and hear what is going on in their lives. Introduce yourself to people you haven't met before.
- 9. Do not judge others. Everyone you meet was created and is loved by God. You don't know what battles the other person has faced or are currently facing. Even if someone appears to be different from you by the style of their hair, whether or not they have tattoos or piercings, they have a right to be in this House of God! You might have more in common with others than you think!
- 10. Volunteer as an usher or in the welcome ministry. Volunteer for one of our other parish ministries or at a one-time event. You will get to know more people and further bond with your family of faith!
- 11. Be aware of the needs of the people around you. Hold open the door for someone coming in behind you. If the person is using a cane or walker or in a wheelchair, they might need a little more time. A warm and patient smile and greeting can let them know you are glad to see them and happy to wait for them.
- 12. Make a special prayer intention each time you attend Mass. Offer it for someone's spiritual, physical, and emotional needs.
- 13. Invite someone to attend Mass with you. You'll be surprised at who says yes! Maybe this is the invitation they have been waiting for.
- 14. On your way out of Church, share with someone (or your family on the way home) about what the readings and homily meant to you personally.

All parishioners are invited to attend a Listening Session with Bishop Stephen D. Parkes as part of the *Reflect, Renew, Rejoice* planning initiative. These townhall-style meetings will give Bishop Parkes the opportunity to learn about the needs, expectations and hopes of the Faithful across the Diocese.

Facilitators will be provided to direct the evening so that the Bishop will be able to simply listen. Each Session will focus on three key questions: 1) As a Diocese, what are we doing well? 2) What are we doing that we could improve upon? 3) Where should we be focused over the next 3-5 years? (Please note that neither the Bishop nor the facilitators will be responding to questions during the Session.)
