

OVERVIEW

The first signs of a humanitarian crisis are emerging in Ukraine after Russia invaded the country from three sides in the early hours of Thursday, February 24. The capital city of Kyiv and the eastern city of Kharkiv were targeted with attacks that quickly spread across central and eastern areas of the country. In less than 24 hours, attacks have displaced people from their homes, especially in those cities and towns along the contact line in the east. As events quickly evolve, Caritas teams are preparing to respond to urgent humanitarian needs, including evacuation, food and safe shelter.



Pastor's Corner 1st Sunday of Lent

LENT IS HERE!

Ash Wednesday, even though it is not a holy day of obligation, is one of the most well attended days in the Church year! So many people want to receive ashes and begin this Holy Season of Lent with Holy Mass. Our 40-day Campaign of Christian Charity has begun. Many of us are doing penances through fasting or increasing our prayer time or prayer exercises or works of charity. What a great time to stop and work on a particular thing that will draw us closer Jesus!

Though we have these individual acts to which we commit, we do not go through our Christian Journey alone. So, we enter this Lenten Season as a community, as a family. I would like to ask each of you to join me in praying for one another like we did last year. Please pray an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a Glory be for all your fellow St. James parishioners. Our intention will be that each of us can be open to the abundant graces the Lord Jesus wants to share with us this Lent. This also binds us together as we go through Lent and journey together towards Easter. We do not go through our life of faith alone. We help each other. We bear one another's burdens. We pray for each other. Let's do this again this year along with our other acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

RITE OF SENDING

At the 11:30 AM mass on Sunday morning, we will have the Rite of Sending. At this Rite, our two catechumens (those to be baptized) and our candidates (those already baptized who will be received into full communion with the Church) will be sent by our St. James community to the Rite of Election with Bishop Parkes that afternoon. They are also sent on the road to Easter where they will receive the abundance of God's grace in Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.

As a community, let's pray for them as they open themselves to the graces and life to which they are being called. Jesus is calling them into the Catholic Church. May he protect and guide them on their journey. May we also help them by our way of life and words of encouragement along the way.

May the Lord Jesus bless you and your families abundantly this Lenten Season!



Intern will work with the CCHD Diocesan Director at the Catholic Pastoral Center in Savannah promoting and overseeing CCHD projects to include community and parish outreach. Applicants must be a Catholic in good standing and over the age of 18 seeking professional opportunities in social ministry fields, community and economic development.

RCIA News!

On Sunday, March 6 at the 11:30 a.m. Mass, the catechumens (those to be Baptized) and candidates (those already Baptized) will be recognized at the Rite of Sending. In the afternoon, the

catechumens will go to the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. At this Rite of Election, the Church makes its "election", that is, the admission of catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part in the sacraments of initiation. This step is called election because the acceptance made by the Church is founded on the election by God, in whose name the Church acts for those catechumens who reaffirm their intentions to advance and who are in a state of readiness. With deliberate will and an enlightened faith, the catechumens must have the intention to receive the sacraments of the Catholic Church, a resolve that is publicly expressed in the actual celebration of the rite. Likewise, although the candidates will not take part in the Rite of Election at the Cathedral, the Call to Continuing Conversion is a reaffirmation on the part of already baptized candidates of their willingness to continue towards the full sacramental life of the Church through fuller and more complete prayerful preparation.


