




### St. James Church Parish Mission Statement

# Did You Know?

- Without the AMS there would be no Catholic chaplains.
   The AMS is the only Catholic diocese in the United States responsible for endorsing priests to serve as military chaplains and for the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers.
- AMS faithful are the men and women serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at a Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - and their families.
- Programs and services readily available in other U.S. diocese, and vital to the men, women, and children served by this Archdiocese, include Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal, Vocations, and the pastonal care of Veterans.
- The AMS is the Archdiocese for the Military Services, not
  of the Military Services. This is an important distinction,
  as it receives no funding from the U.S. Government or
  U.S. Military and has no parishes from which to receive a
  weekly assessment. Instead, it must rely on the generosity
  of individuals, foundations, and organizations whose
  values and priorities align with its mission, programs and
  services.
- The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only U.S. Vocations Program that provides priests to serve as military chaplains, and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers.
- In 2021, the number of sacraments celebrated for AMS faithful included 1,428 baptisms, 975 confirmations, 1,070 first Holy Communions, and 192 marriages.

# AMS Coat of Arms

The coat of arms of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA is divided into three sections, one in red, one in silver or white, and one in blue – the traditional colors of the United States. In the uppermost portion, there is an American Bald Eagle holding in each claw the universal symbol of peace, a green olive branch. In the middle portion, there is a silver cross on the outline meridians of the earth.

In the lowest, the red portion of these arms, are the gold and silver crossed keys of Saint Peter. The composition of the arms conveys the message and mission of the Archdiocese for the Military Services

— to be Americans bearing peace; to proclaim Christ all over the world; and to carry out the mission of the Church to offer healing through the forgiveness of sins.

# PASTOR'S CORNER 32<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### PRIORITIES AND THE ETERNAL PERSPECTIVE

I love the book of Maccabees! The whole story given to us is inspired by the Holy Spirit and is the Word of God, not merely a history of Jewish resistance against the Greeks. From beginning to end, it concerns the proper order of things, priorities, and the Eternal Perspective. This group of Jews remained faithful to the covenant with God and the law of God. They did not fear the death of the body, but the death of the soul.

Their priorities were in the proper order. They did not obey the ruling power of the day, the government that told them to violate God's law and offer sacrifices to the Greek gods. Rather, they resisted a government that wanted to push them to the side and in the end kill them. Some might draw conclusions from our society and culture today and about our present situation, but I want to focus on our personal lives, our family lives. What are the priorities in our lives? Is our relationship with God and our children's relationship with God more important than their excelling on the court or on the field, or is it not? Can we show by the way we spend our time, our money, our attention that Jesus and our relationship with Him is the most important thing in our lives? Does His Truth, Goodness, and Beauty permeate our homes, our relationships?

My brothers and sisters, our eyes must be fixed on Him, not on the things of this world. I pray for you and for me that we live our lives personally and in our families with our children in the proper order with the proper priorities in the Eternal Perspective.

### HEALTH UPDATE

A repeat of last week's update...I realize that I haven't given an update on my health situation in a little while. I have finished my 6<sup>th</sup> cycle of Chemotherapy. The Doctors want me to do a total of 8-12 cycles. So I have at least 2 more cycles to run or at the most 6. I am either 75% to the finish-line for Chemo or 50% towards it! Either way, I am ready for whatever course this journey takes because I am buoyed by your prayers, encouraged by your love, and strengthened by your amazing support! Thank you so much for your prayers!

At the end of the Chemotherapy, I will have surgery in Atlanta at Emory. This will be either in mid-December or, at the latest, mid-February. I cannot tell you how much your prayers mean to me and how much effect they have on me every day! You are journeying with me step by step and I cannot thank Almighty God for each of you enough! You are in my daily thanksgiving and my prayers to His Majesty! I love you all!

May the Lord Jesus bless each of you and your families abundantly this week!


