

Pastor's Corner 1st Week of Lent 2023

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weeks Pastor's Corner will be in the form of a letter as I prepare for my surgery and my time away from daily parish life and masses. There is just too much to write for a normal column!

June 2022 began a whole new experience for me and my year and life changed on a dime! One minute things were fine and then the next, I was in emergency surgery and recovery with the diagnosis of cancer. That diagnosis and the extent to which the cancer was filling my abdomen filled me with fear and trepidation. Almighty God placed me in the hands of very competent and skilled surgeons, nurses, and oncologists! He then blessed me with you, my St. James family! You reacted in many beautiful ways to assist me! Praying the Prayer to Our Lady Untier of Knots after mass. Praying the rosary every Thursday in the Church for me. Fixing dinners and dropping off cards. What a gift you are to me!

When we are faced with such a challenge and reality, questions arise and test our faith. Our response could be to blame God and get angry with him or to run towards Him and accept the cross given and the journey on which we are beckoned. I pray that I have chosen the latter. There were some twists and turns on the journey, but God has been there every step of the way! His encouragement and strength have been omni-present! Around every corner of every doctor's office, hospital, and clinic has been someone or something that He has ordained and set before me to assist me! What a beautiful gift! He is so good!

He has blessed me with you, my St. James family and community! Each of you has been such a comfort and consolation walking with me through this journey of chemotherapy and anticipation of surgery. It seemed like 12 cycles of chemo over 6 months was going to take forever, but now it is over and the next chapter begins!

Tuesday, February 28th, I enter a 15 hour surgery (HIPEC) at 7:00 AM in Atlanta. I know you will be supporting me with your prayers throughout the day! Please also pray for the surgeons, doctors, and nurses who will be caring for me! I will make sure that they know you will be praying for them! Please also pray for my family – my parents and

siblings. They will need the peace of Jesus as they wait for me all day. That waiting can be worse than anything! I'll be sleeping as they work on me, but my family will be pacing and waiting and nervous. They need your prayers too!

I will recuperate here at St. James surrounded by you and your love and support! There is no other place I would rather be! You have walked with me through this journey and have been such a consolation and encouragement to me. The well wishes and prayers and cards have ministered to me in ways that I cannot explain. This community of believers never wavered in showing love and support. This has been a humbling experience and a complete grace from Almighty God! You are a grace and a gift me!

My goal is to enter into the Sacred Triduum with you to celebrate the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Lord Jesus in April. March will be a time of recuperation and healing after the surgery. I won't be able to be at the St. Patrick's Day parade, so I will watch it on WTOC! The surgery will be extensive and will require some recovery time for healing.

The great season of Lent began last week and we enter into our disciplines to hone our weapons and skills to battle the spiritual evils fighting for our eternal lives. Let's do this together. We all take on different Lenten penances and practices by increasing our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I am going to ask that we all take up one more practice. Please pray an Our Father, Hail Mary, and a Glory be for your fellow parishioners during Lent. We are in this together and we are never alone in our journeys the Lord gives us to walk!

Thank you for walking with me during this journey! Your faith and prayer and love have sustained me each and every day! At times, I am overwhelmed by God's love shining through you! Be assured that you and your families are in my daily prayers and I thank the Lord for you every day! I love y'all!

Let's pray for one another and accompany each other during this season of Lent and celebrate Easter together in a few weeks! May the Lord Jesus shower you with His abundant blessings!




