My dear parishioners of St. James,

Well, I'm home from Atlanta and back at the cottage to recuperate from surgery and get my strength back.

Thank you, thank you for all the prayers, love, and support! It has pulled me through these last 8 months, including these last few weeks. I cannot tell you how full my heart is with gratitude to and for each of you! You have prayed and prayed, storming heaven for me, and I cannot thank you enough!

Many, if not all, of you already know that our hopes for the surgery did not materialize. Rather, my condition is the same as it was right before the surgery, and there is nothing more they can do for me at the present time. The surgery was supposed to be the curative option, as chemotherapy doesn't have much effect on this type of cancer. I will consult my oncologist here in Savannah about where to go from here.

It has been difficult to digest and process, as you can imagine, and that will continue into the future. The Lord has been with me every step of the way, and will continue to be walking right here with me. Our Heavenly Father has a plan for me for however long He gives me. If He wants a miracle to happen, so be it. If He gives me only a few years more and asks me to bear this cross to the end, so be it. He will give me the grace to live it, for this is my path of sanctification.

I will resume my priestly ministry and pastoral duties at St. James as soon as I am able. This is not a ticking time bomb or an immediate death sentence. Rather, it is a cross that Almighty God has asked me to bear for however long He desires. Looking forward, I cannot wait to see what His Majesty does with me, in me, and through me as I bear this cross.

I feel healthy, though I can always lose weight! So, after a Lent of recovery and embracing the cross more and more, I hope to be back at Easter to somewhat full strength and speed, but it will be modified.

Please pray that I can accept with dignity and grace this cross the Lord has asked me to bear moving forward. Your prayers, love, and support encourage and strengthen me to walk this journey that lies before me. Be assured of my prayers for each of you and your families. Thank you so much for all your prayers, love, and support!

Next Sunday, I will give an in-person update at the beginning of each Mass.

May it be done to us according to His will!

† Completely trust in Jesus


Sooner would heaven and earth turn into nothingness than would my mercy not embrace a trusting soul (Diary, 1074).

+ CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY

Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for will be compatible with My will (Diary, 1731). Even if a sinner were most hardened, if only once he will recite this Chaplet, he will obtain grace from My infinite mercy (Diary, 687). At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say this chaplet; or when others say it for a dying person, the pardon is the same (Diary, 811).

Using a rosary, pray the Chaplet in the following manner:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and The Apostles Creed.
- 2. Then, on the Our Father beads, say: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 3. On the 10 Hail Mary beads, say: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. (Repeat step 2 and 3 for all five decades).
- 4. Conclude with: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. (repeat three times)

Pray during the Hour of Great Mercy (3 PM)

At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy. In this hour, I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion (Diary, 1320).
