

SUPPORT THE Solidarity Fund for the CHURCH IN AFRICA

On December 8, 2020, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and the 150th anniversary of Pope Pius IX's declaration of St. Joseph as patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis proclaimed a special jubilee year of St. Joseph that lasted until December 8, 2021. In doing so, the Holy Father called Catholics everywhere to look to St. Joseph as an example of unconditional love, humble service, and courageous fatherhood.

In conjunction with this Year of St. Joseph, the Episcopal Conference of Malawi, through its national Pastoral Commission, organized a training program for Catholic men across all eight of the country's dioceses. Additional workshops on parenting, socialization, and spirituality helped the participants develop the positive gifts that they have to offer as husbands and fathers. With a grant from the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, 160 men from across Malawi were able to participate and then return to their homes as trainers for other men in their communities.

The solidarity fund supports pastoral ministries throughout Africa that help to strengthen families and give them the pastoral support they need to flourish and grow in faith. PASTOR'S CORNER 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION SCHOOL

The next two weeks I will be in Augusta attending my second session of the Alleluia School of Spiritual Direction (<u>www.alleluiassd.com</u>) as part of my continuing education. People come to me and other priests often to discuss their spiritual life – their prayer, relationship with God, relationships with others, and many other things that impact their life. This school has and will help me hone my skills of prayer and listening to the Holy Spirit so that I can be a better priest, pastor, and director of souls.

July of 2021 was my first session of 3 going through the school. Last summer was to be my second session, but we all know what happened last summer! I was a bit distracted and physically incapable of being there! The topic for the first session was Prayer. This session will be Healing and the third session will be Growth. 


