

Pastor's Corner 1st Sunday of Advent

Congratulations, Mary, for your distinguished service and for the gift you are to your brothers and sisters here at St. James the Less!

BLESSED ADVENT!

Advent begins today! I hope that you have your wreaths out and your Advent Calendars hanging in your homes! We begin this Sunday a period of anxious anticipation of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ! We prepare by getting our hearts and souls clean. We prepare by resisting the rush and busyness of the month and purposefully enter into some stillness and quiet time with the Lord Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. How will you prepare?

We have ordered some Advent Companions from Magnificat publications. This can be a resource and tool for you to take advantage of this beautiful season of Advent. There is a limited supply in the narthex, but you can also order one at <u>www.magnificat.com</u>.

Last year, we had the longest Advent we could possibly have. This year Advent is the shortest it could ever be! December 24 is the 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Day, December 25, is a Monday. So, what does that mean? In short, it means you will need to go to Mass twice!

To fulfill your Sunday obligation for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, you must come to Mass either at the Saturday evening Vigil (5:00 PM) or on Sunday morning (7:30 a.m., 9 a.m. or 11:30 a.m.).

To fulfill your Christmas Mass obligation, you must come to Mass again either Sunday evening (Dec. 24) or Monday morning (Dec. 25).

We will begin Christmas Masses at 5:00 PM on Sunday, December 24. We will have two Masses offered at that time – one in church and one in the gym. We will also have Masses at 8 p.m., again with one in church and one in the gym. There will be one Mass offered on Monday, Christmas Day, at 10:00 AM (one of the most beautiful masses of the year in my opinion!).


I urge you to begin planning your 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas mass schedule for your family!


