

Feast of the Epiphany



The Epiphany is indeed a great feast, and the joy caused us by the birth of our Jesus must be renewed on it, for as though it were a second Christmas day, it shows us our incarnate God in a new light. It leaves us all the sweetness of the dear Babe of Bethlehem, Who has appeared to us already in love; but to this it adds its own grand manifestation of the divinity of our Jesus. At Christmas, it was a few shepherds that were invited by the angels to go and recognize the Word made flesh; but now, at the Epiphany, the voice of God Himself calls the whole world to adore this Jesus and hear Him.

The mystery of the Epiphany brings upon us three magnificent rays of the Sun of Justice, our Savior. In the calendar of pagan Rome, this sixth day of January was devoted to the celebration of a triple triumph of Augustus, the founder of the Roman Empire: but when Jesus, our Prince of Peace, Whose empire knows no limits, had secured victory to His Church by the blood of the martyrs, then did this His Church decree that a triple triumph of the immortal King should be substituted, in the Christian calendar, for those other three triumphs which had been won by the adopted son of Caesar.

The sixth of January, therefore, restored the celebration of Our Lord's birth to the twenty-fifth of December; but, in return, there was united in the one same Epiphany three manifestations of Jesus' glory: the mystery of the Magi coming from the East, under the guidance of a star, and adoring the Infant of Bethlehem as the divine King; the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, Who, while standing in the waters of the Jordan, was proclaimed by the eternal Father as Son of God; and thirdly, the mystery of the divine power of this same Jesus, when He changed the water into wine at the marriage feast of Cana.

Epiphany Customs

Blessing of Epiphany Water, Chalk, Lintels of Homes

It is customary in some places for parish priests to bless water on the eve of Epiphany, which is used for the blessing of homes the next day. Chalk for each family is also blessed so that they may mark the names of the Three Magi over their doors, as a witness of the Faith, to beseech salvific benefits, and protection against evil.

Epiphany Inscription Over the Doorway of the Home 20 + C + M + B + 24

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They also abbreviate the Latin words "Christus mansionem benedicat." "May Christ bless the house." The letters recall the day on which the inscription is made, as well as the purpose of blessing.

The crosses represent the protection of the Precious Blood of Christ, whom we invoke, and the holiness of the Three Magi sanctified by their adoration of the Infant Christ. The inscription is made above the front door, so that all who enter and depart this year may enjoy God's blessing. The month of January still bears the name of the Roman god Janus, the doorkeeper of heaven and protector of the beginning and end of things. This blessing "christens" the ancient Roman observance of the first month. The inscription is made of chalk, a product of clay, which recalls the human nature taken by the Adorable and Eternal Word of God in the womb of the Virgin Mary, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The lintel of the main door of the house (and other doors if desired) is marked by a senior member of the household (usually the father) in the following way:

20 + C + M + B + 24

While saying the following prayer:

"The Three Wise Men,	
Caspar, (write the letter "C")	с
Melchior, (M)	СМ
and Balthazar, (B)	СМВ
followed the star of God's Son Who became man,	
Two Thousand (20)	20 C M B
and twenty-four years ago. (24)	20 C M B 24
May Christ bless our home "++" (first two crosses)	20 + C + M B 24
and remain with us through the new year "++" (last two crosses).	20 + C + M + B + 24

The senior member may then proceed to sprinkle the interior of the home with the blessed Epiphany Water.



PASTOR'S CORNER EPIPHANY SUNDAY

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

One more day! I can still wish you and your families a MERRY CHRISTMAS this weekend! Come Tuesday, the Christmas Season ends and we begin Ordinary Time (which is never ordinary because God became man, the Eternal entered into and sanctified time!).

For us Christians, Christmas begins on December 25th with the Solemnity of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ and it ends with the Feast of Baptism of the Lord (this year on January 8th). This is the Christmas Season! We should be greeting people with the words, "Merry Christmas" each day of this Season! One more day! Let's hear it...MERRY CHRISTMAS!

EPIPHANY SUNDAY

Our celebration of Epiphany marks the visit of the Magi to the stable in Bethlehem, where they found the child Jesus with Mary and Joseph. They brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. What gifts will you bring to Jesus this year? Time in prayer would be a good thing – reading and meditating on the daily readings for 15 minutes each day or committing to an hour of adoration once a week or once a month with a few friends. Maybe a commitment to praying a rosary as a family Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday is a gift the whole family can bring to Jesus this year. We have heard it said each and every Christmas – presents and material gifts are wonderful, but time with family and friends is the greatest gift of all. This year, perhaps we as a parish can give the gift of Time in prayer to Jesus. Let's each make a gift to spend more time with Him daily (and perhaps on a retreat or a conference (Men's Conference on January 27th or the Parish Mission during Lent)). This one and all the many wonderful devotions and prayers help our faith become part of our daily rhythm of life. Think of other ways we can do this!




