



Feast of the Epiphany



The Epiphany is indeed a great feast, and the joy caused us by the birth of our Jesus must be renewed on it, for as though it were a second Christmas day, it shows us our incarnate God in a new light. It leaves us all the sweetness of the dear Babe of Bethlehem, Who has appeared to us already in love; but to this it adds its own grand manifestation of the divinity of our Jesus. At Christmas, it was a few shepherds that were invited by the angels to go and recognize the Word made flesh; but now, at the Epiphany, the voice of God Himself calls the whole world to adore this Jesus and hear Him.

The mystery of the Epiphany brings upon us three magnificent rays of the Sun of Justice, our Savior. In the calendar of pagan Rome, this sixth day of January was devoted to the celebration of a triple triumph of Augustus, the founder of the Roman Empire: but when Jesus, our Prince of Peace, Whose empire knows no limits, had secured victory to His Church by the blood of the martyrs, then did this His Church decree that a triple triumph of the immortal King should be substituted, in the Christian calendar, for those other three triumphs which had been won by the adopted son of Caesar.

The sixth of January, therefore, restored the celebration of Our Lord's birth to the twenty-fifth of December; but, in return, there was united in the one same Epiphany three manifestations of Jesus' glory: the mystery of the Magi coming from the East, under the guidance of a star, and adoring the Infant of Bethlehem as the divine King; the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, Who, while standing in the waters of the Jordan, was proclaimed by the eternal Father as Son of God; and thirdly, the mystery of the divine power of this same Jesus, when He changed the water into winc at the marriage feast of Cana.

Epiphany Customs

Blessing of Epiphany Water, Chalk, Lintels of Homes

It is customary in some places for parish priests to bless water on the eve of Epiphany, which is used for the blessing of homes the next day. Chalk for each family is also blessed so that they may mark the names of the Three Magi over their doors, as a witness of the Faith, to be seech salvific benefits, and protection against evil.

Epiphany Inscription Over the Doorway of the Home

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They also abbreviate the Latin words "Christus mansionem benedicat." "May Christ bless the house." The letters recall the day on which the inscription is made, as well as the purpose of blessing.

The crosses represent the protection of the Precious Blood of Christ, whom we invoke, and the holiness of the Three Magi sanctified by their adoration of the Infant Christ. The inscription is made above the front door, so that all who enter and depart this year may enjoy God's blessing. The month of January still bears the name of the Roman god Janus, the doorkeeper of heaven and protector of the beginning and end of things. This blessing "christens" the ancient Roman observance of the first month. The inscription is made of chalk, a product of clay, which recalls the human nature taken by the Adorable and Eternal Word of God in the womb of the Virgin Mary, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The lintel of the main door of the house (and other doors if desired) is marked by a senior member of the household (usually the father) in the following way:

$$20 + C + M + B + 24$$

While saying the following prayer:

"The Three Wise Men,

Caspar, (write the letter "C")

Melchior, (M)

and Balthazar, (B)

followed the star of God's Son Who became man,

Two Thousand (20)

and twenty-four years ago. (24)

May Christ bless our home "++" (first two crosses)

and remain with us through the new year "++" (last two crosses).

The senior member may then proceed to sprinkle the interior of the home with the blessed Epiphany Water.
