



- 2. Go to the box marked "Required Documents." If it is pink, you have documents to sign.
- 3. Right-click both document titles (Ministerial Code of Conduct **and** Sex Abuse Policy) and for each one, select "open link in new tab."
- 4. Read each document, scroll down, and apply your electronic signature.
- 5. Return to your Home tab to see if any other outstanding compliance items are required. To see the most up-to-date information after signing the documents, you may need to refresh the page by clicking the circular arrow at the top, near the URL.
