

In 1874, Benedictine monks from the St. Vincent Monastery in Latrobe, Pennsylvania arrived on the Isle Hope to establish a novitiate, a chapel, and a school for emancipated slaves on Skidaway Island. The chapel was located on land and in a building donated by Stephen Dupon. After one year, all of the monks except one had died due to the yellow fever epidemic.

Because of the epidemic, the Benedictine community on Isle of Hope was decimated and had to leave the island, but returned for 11 years in 1877. They left in 1888, only to return to serve the faithful in that area in 1908. The monks served there until the 1970s, when the diocesan priests ministering at St. James Parish assumed responsibility. The chapel then became a mission of St. James Parish. Much of the original chapel remains in present-day, including the pews and altar rail, which are made from heart pine. Today, Holy Mass is celebrated on the first Sunday of every month.




#### **Prayers for Victims of Abuse**


