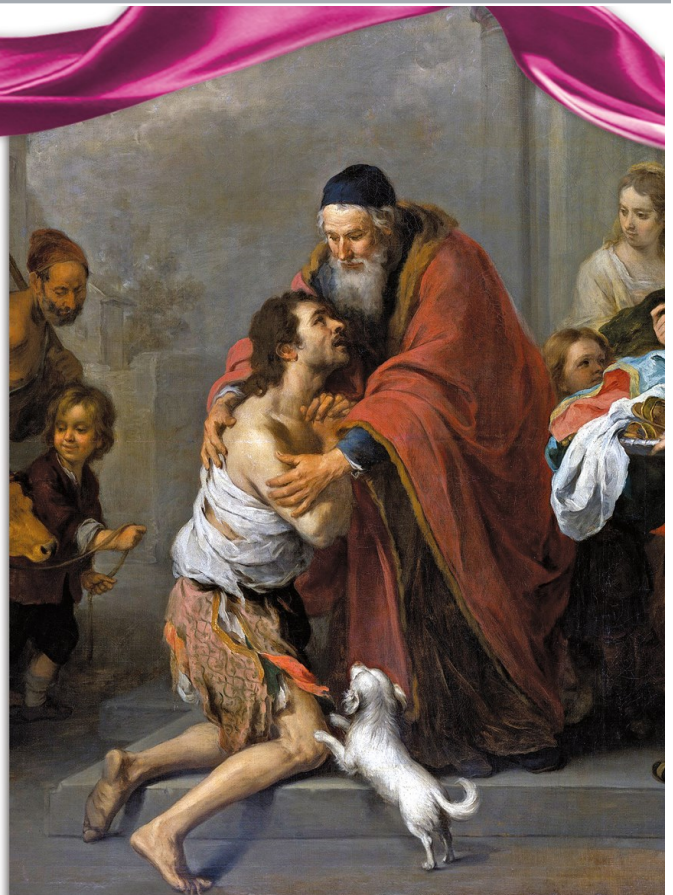

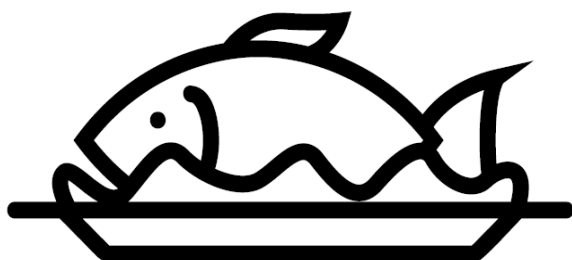
Saint James Parish Mission Statement

The day before Ash Wednesday, I went to the Emergency Room and was admitted to the hospital where I stayed for 10 days solving, with the help of wonderful doctors and nurses, a variety of cancer related issues. This resulted in an NG tube and nothing but ice chips for 3 days (those ice chips were the best!), a week of radiation treatment, the prescription of a new chemotherapy, and rounds of antibiotics. The week after I returned home, the effects of the radiation hit me and this week I started my new chemotherapy so I am feeling the results of that too. So, Lent and this March have been quite remarkable!

My beautiful friends, I cannot count the multitude of moments that thinking of your love, support, and prayers for me pouring into me, and into the very throne room of Almighty God, gave me courage, strength, and perseverance to accept, embrace, and endure the present issues and whatever lies before me. Where would I be without you? I shudder to think of the darkness shattered by God's light and love shown to me through you and to me directly. What hope and joy you give me in Christ!

I cannot wait to be with you once again at the altar, in the confessional, before and after masses, in the school, and the activities of the parish! Daily my strength is improving. You will see me here and there at various masses and events and meetings, but I must be careful to get the rest I need to continue to serve you and minister to you as a good shepherd. Being your pastor is a such a great honor, privilege, and blessing! The journey the Lord has me on is for my own eternal salvation and also your eternal salvation. May I walk it with dignity, nobility, grace, and joy!

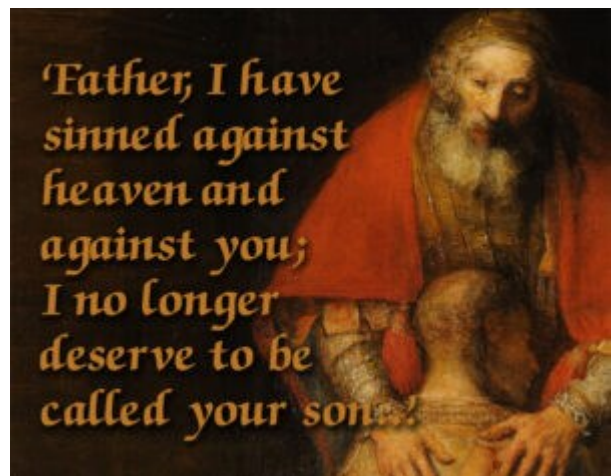

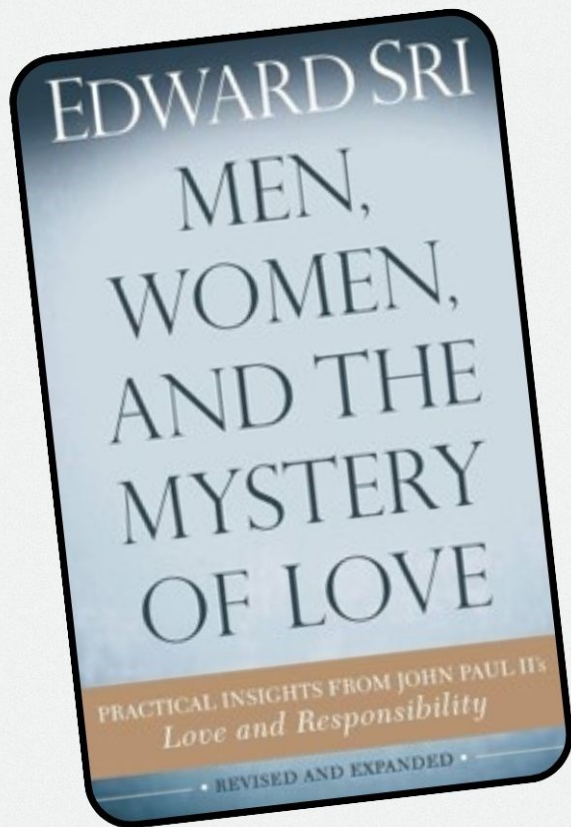

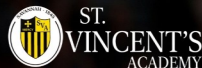

Fourth Sunday of Lent Arm the Photon Torpedoes

The book of Joshua tells of the Israelites coming into the Promised Land, where they no longer needed to be fed with manna as in the desert. They had been wandering much longer than expected because of their unfaithfulness. But now they are forgiven, and so celebrate the Passover with food from the land. Then we hear the Gospel parable about another feast. This one is also a celebration of forgiveness, for the prodigal son has returned to his father, and the father's forgiveness shows us how willing God is to forgive us. That's where we end the parable, right?

Wrong. The parable continues with the older son's complaint about a feast for his brother. That son cannot forgive his brother and is angry at the father for welcoming the prodigal back. This is where we come in. Most of us have no trouble asking God's forgiveness. But we may have trouble forgiving others. We are so used to thinking in terms of justice that we are not satisfied with forgiveness. When I have been hurt, I feel like hitting back.

So we have to ask ourselves whose idea of justice we live by. Is it the human expectation of an eye for an eye? Or is it God's justice, which is mercy and forgiveness? When someone cuts you off in traffic, do you feel like firing the photon torpedoes, or offering forgiveness? The Golden Rule could be "Forgive others as you would be forgiven." Jesus gave his life for the sins of the world. Do we have the right to ask for more? Tom Schmidt
